

With sudden digitization amid the pandemic, numerous online accounts are to be created for various purposes. The most common problem faced by elders is remembering passwords for multiple accounts. As such they end up overexposing their accounts by using the same password, leading to possible compromise of all accounts, if any one gets breached. So, I have come up with few tips for creating easy-to-remember passwords! <u>Customize Online Accounts passwords</u> • My Big Basket Password -> MyBigBasketP@55w0rd	While creating passwords, avoid personal information such as birth dates, spouse name, name / birth date of grandchildren Create ATM PINs from the ATM card number itself • Suppose the ATM Card no is 4207 3991 0215 3369 ⇒ PIN may be 4303 (taking 1st digits of each set of four) ⇒ or 7159 (taking 1st digits of each set of four) ⇒ or set any other pattern Turn normal passphrase into weird sentence like below:
 Use a passphrase such as-> Take the initial letters -> Make the 1st & last letter caps -> 	jack and jill went up the hill. jajwuth JajwutH
