In this Summer Vacation, Pinku has planned to visit Shimla. One day, while he was searching for Hotels at Shimla in the Search Engine, he found some Ads showing

on the top of the screen with phone numbers of hotels.

Yes. How can I help you? I want to check availability of three double bed rooms at your hotel from 1st June to 5th June. I would like to inform Sir that right now, there is a tremendous rush at Shimla. I understand. In Summers there is a huge rush. But please see what can be done.

After a month when Pinku reached the

hotel at Shimla, he didn't find any room booked in his name. He called at the mobile number at which he discussed after seeing the ad. Mobile was switched off and the Hotel Manager was telling a different



contact number for the hotel. He also hinted on a racket of online fraudsters.

Pinku then called Tenali and briefed the complete scenario.

Pinku, I can understand your situation. You were duped by an online fraudster.

You should always verify or cross check the contact number from reputable Tourism Websites / Travel Agency / Directly from the Hotel's website before doing any online transaction.

Immediately call the Cybercrime helpline number **1930** and lodge a complaint at National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal <u>www.cybercrime.gov.in</u>.



## Safety Tips to Avoid Such Fraud

Do not search Contact number of Hotels randomly at any search engine. It may come up with wrong results.

Always refer to official website of the hotel or reputable Tourism website for any type of advance booking.

**Do not trust unknown caller, random advertising links etc. for quick & advance booking.** 

**Go for trusted and popular travel** website that are used by large number of people.

**Do not trust deep discount offers which are too good to be true.** 

Ask for the original stamped bills / receipts / invoice, if booking is done online.
